# The School and Community

Founded in 1909, The Bishop's School is an independent, coeducational, college-preparatory day school pursuing intellectual, artistic, and athletic excellence in the context of the Episcopal tradition. The school currently enrolls 780 students in grades 6 through 12 from 68 zip codes throughout San Diego County. Many of our students commute more than an hour each morning. Of the 89 faculty members, 57 have master's degrees and 6 hold doctorate or terminal degrees; the student-teacher ratio is 13 to 1. There are 148 students in the Class of 2011.

The Bishop's School is the most selective independent school in San Diego County; standardized testing, school records, teacher recommendations, and a personal interview are reviewed in building each class. Last year, The Bishop's School distributed \$3 million in financial aid to just over 20 percent of the student body. Students of color and international students make up 32 percent of the student population.

# **Academic Offerings**

As a college preparatory school where 100 percent of graduates plan to attend four-year colleges or universities, the curriculum has been developed to reflect that central purpose of the mission. Honors courses are offered in English III, Advanced Pre-Calculus, Chinese III and IV, French III, Latin III, and Spanish III. The Bishop's School offers 22 Advanced Placement (AP) Courses in Art History, Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Chemistry, Chinese Language and Culture, English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition, European History, French Language, Government & Politics-Comparative, Government and Politics-U.S., Latin-Vergil, Economics, Physics B, Psychology, Spanish Language, Spanish Literature, Statistics, Studio Art, and U.S. History.

In order to allow students with a special interest in a particular field of study to pursue interests beyond the bounds of the AP program, the School also offers several "Advanced Honors" courses that allow a small number to study in a college seminar-like setting. These include English, Math, Physics, Science Research, French, Latin, Spanish and Philosophy of Religion.


#### Diversity and Inclusion Statement

#### **Graduation Requirements**

Students must earn a minimum of 48 semester credits in grades nine through twelve to graduate; 32 of these credits must be in academic courses. One year of upper school math and foreign language courses taken in middle school can count toward this total. Students are required to carry a minimum of six courses per semester with at least four being academic courses; seniors may carry five courses. Minimum requirements in each discipline are:

English – 4 years Mathematics – 3 years History – 2 years Science – 3 years (2 lab sciences) Foreign Language – 3 years Religious Studies – 1 year Fine Arts – 1 year Physical Education – 8 trimesters

Most students go beyond departmental requirements. However, students are cautioned against overloading by taking too demanding a course load while participating in additional activities. Physical Education requirements are met through both on and off-campus athletic involvement.

# Statement on Discipline

As of the 2010 – 2011 academic year, "probation" represents the most serious disciplinary offenses at The Bishop's School. In the case of probation or suspension for disciplinary reasons, it is the School's policy to report probations and suspensions issued by the Discipline Committee and Head of School to the colleges to which the student has applied or will attend.

In the case of expulsion in the senior year, it is the School's policy to report that change of status to the colleges to which the student has applied or will attend.

# Accreditations & Memberships

The Bishop's School is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), and is a member of the National Association of Episcopal Schools, The College Board, CAIS, NAIS, NACAC, WACAC, ACCIS (Founding School) and the Cum Laude Society.

# Co-Curricular Offerings

The Bishop's School encourages development in all aspects of a student's life. The athletic program has been designed to be broad enough to prepare gifted athletes to compete at the college level while, at the same time, insuring that all students are exposed to the lifelong benefits of athletics and physical fitness. In the course of a school year 70 percent of Bishop's Upper School students play on one or more of the 40 varsity and junior varsity teams.

In addition to a highly competitive varsity athletic program, the School also has select, award-winning performing arts groups. The Bishop's Singers, Acting Workshop, and Performing Dance Group are audition-only ensembles that represent the greatest performing arts talents of the School and require significant time commitment outside of the classroom.

# Community Service

Each Bishop's student must complete 100 hours of community service during grades nine through twelve. A minimum of 20 hours must be earned in grades nine through eleven, and 40 hours must be completed in the senior year. The 131 members of the Class of 2010 completed 26,040 hours of individual service.

# Honor Roll and Policy on Class Rank

Honor Roll for a semester is awarded to students with two A's in academic subjects and no grade below B- in any subject. Summer school grades do not count toward Honor Roll, although they are included the student's GPA.

Honors, AP, and Advanced Honors courses are weighted one point in GPA calculation. The Bishop's School does not calculate class rank.

#### 2010 AP Exam Results

In the academic year 2009 – 2010, 343 students in grades nine through twelve sat for a total of 739 Advanced Placement exams in 24 subjects.

Of the exams completed by Bishop's students, 91% earned a score of 3, 4, or 5.
