

WELCOME NEW TENURE TRACK FACULTY

Antonio De La Garza, Communication – Assistant Professor in Rhetorical Studies Dr. De La Garza received his Ph.D. in Rhetoric and Critical Cultural Studies from the University of Utah. He uses critical-cultural and qualitative methods to investigate communication's role in racism and resistance with expertise in immigration rhetoric.

Erica Freer, Economics – Assistant Professor in Urban & Regional Economics Dr. Freer completed her doctorate studies at Claremont Graduate University. Her research interests are applied microeconomics, urban economics, public, welfare, spatial, health and environmental economics.

Aditi Malik, Political Science & Global Studies – Assistant Professor in Political Science & Global Studies. Dr. Aditi received her Ph.D. in Political Science from Northwestern University in 2015 and completed a post-doctoral appointment at Penn State in 2015 – 2016. Her dissertation is titled, "Coalitions and Conflict: Party Systems and Electoral Violence in Kenya and India." Her research interests include the micro-politics of conflict, electoral violence, ethnic conflict, human rights, transitional justice, the politics of East Africa and the Great Lakes (Kenya, Rwanda, Burundi), South Asian politics, and mixed-methods research.

Kimber Quinney, History – Assistant Professor in History

Dr. Quinney earned an M.A. and Ph.D. from the University of California, Santa Barbara, with a research emphasis on the relationship between ethnicity and U.S. Foreign Policy. She will assume the position of Coordinator and Advisor to the History–Social Science Program.

Elizabeth Ridder, Liberal Studies – Assistant Professor in Physical Geography Dr. Ridder achieved a doctorate at Arizona State University, School of Geographical Sciences and Urban Planning. Her thesis was titled, "Landscape transformation of Cyprus from 1970 through 2070."

Jon Spenard, Anthropology – Assistant Professor in Archaeology

Dr. Spenard completed a Graduate Certificate—University Teaching in 2014 and Ph.D. from the University of California, Riverside. His research interests include Mesoamerican archaeology (Maya focus), anthropological archaeology, landscape archaeology, archaeology of ritual, archaeology of memory, and settlement patterns.

William Tsai, Psychology – Assistant Professor in Clinical Psychology Dr. Tsai received his Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology from UCLA in 2016. His dissertation was titled "Cultural Differences in Emotion Expression and Suppression: Implications for Health and Well-being." His research interests are in ethnic minority mental health, emotion regulation, and stress and coping. He completed a clinical internship at the West LA VA Medical Center.


